

One thing I would ask is that before any law is considered to be changed, is all the current Ct. gun laws are read to all the members of the panel. This should be the first thing done so that each member knows the current laws and understands them. It also might be helpful to also know the federal laws. You might be surprised to know that some very powerful fire arms built before the early 1900's can be purchased with out any permit. Also black powder guns can be purchased by anyone without a permit.

From what I have read most of all these mass shootings have been done by persons who have mental health problems. I would suggest some strong laws to have the police notified of these persons. I believe one of the questions that should be asked prior to a gun purchase is do you have any metal health problems. This should be one of the primary back round checking points that needs to be checked prior to approval of the purchase. This check should also be applied to all members of the household. Under no conditions should a permit be given out to these persons.

I have read some articles about a new process of printing gun parts and guns, on these new home printers. they say you can build the gun it will fire, it is made of plastic that cannot be picked up by current methods as there are no metal parts involved. the articles indicate there are no laws on the books to prevent this action. This should be looked into now.
