I am Jennifer Phelps from Fairfield, CT and I am speaking out AGAINST proposed gun control measures. I'm sure that our governor would love to follow in the footsteps of the State of New York in strict gun legislation, but that is not the answer. Connecticut is in a unique position, particularly because we are the home to many large gun and ammunition manufacturers. Ruger in Southport, Colt in Hartford, Remington Arms, etc. Gun control won't only hurt the law abiding citizens of this state, but FURTHER hurt the floundering economy of this state. Do not give businesses yet another reason to leave Connecticut in favor of more business friendly neighboring states.
