

Testimony in favor of an assault weapons ban.

As a resident of the state of CT for over 30 years, I have raised a family here and have two children that have gone through the public school system. Gun violence has been a concern of ours for many years, and the recent tragic events at Newtown's Sandy Hook School have put this issue in sharp focus.

We in this State have been far too cavalier in the proliferation of guns. The ease of which Adam Lanze was able to get a hold of such devastating weapons to do his perverse killing is astounding. They only present a huge risk to the lives and safety of the citizens of our State and must be banned from sale in our State. Surely these are the rights that are being infringed under current circumstances.
