

Many laws have been past with regard to firearms, regulations and keeping them locked up. In my opinion, the enforcement of this laws has become very lax. The laxness begins at the point of purchase. It should be a mandate that venders should be made to keep records of, a) the type of firearms being sold, b) the ammunitions sold for the particular firearm, c ) photo ID of the purchaser, d) age of purchaser, e) fingerprint of the purchaser,

f) the date and point of the sale, g) the intended use for the purchase, h) where and in what state the firearm will be used, i) that the purchase is not being made for A) a third party,

B) an under-aged person, C) a person knowingly to have a history of mental disability and or D) A person who is knowingly a user of illegal drugs. An affidavit must be signed by both the vender and purchaser to be kept at the point of purchase, supporting a record has been keep of the information required by the "mandate" to be inspected without notice by the law enforcement agency setting forth the requirements. For failure to keep such records as mandated and or should information be provided that is not accurate, under penalty of perjury, the violator shall be arrested, prosecuted and fined.
