I am a registered, responsible, CT gun owner, and like all members of society was sickened and heartbroken at the recent murders in Newtown.

I own firearms for two reasons: to protect my family and for the sport of target shooting. As the events of Newtown, Cheshire, and so many others have shown us, the police cannot protect us in a timely manner. It is up to the individual to protect himself/herself and his/her family.

Following the events at Newtown, one would hope that as citizens of Connecticut, registered gun owners would be treated with a modicum of respect by our elected representatives and the media.....unfortunately, this has not been the case. As a group we have been vilified, treated like criminals, and portrayed as an undesirable segment of the population. We have heard ridiculous proposals such as: publicizing the names and addresses of registered gun owners, making guns that fire more than one bullet illegal, a 50% tax on ammunition, mandatory gun liability insurance, and in one sickening comparison (as reported in a Hartford Courant article): creating a registry of CT gun owners similar to the sex offender registry. Many of these proposals will only serve to be a financial burden on lawful gun owners during difficult economic times.
