CONNECTICUT GOVERNOR MALLOY'S HYPOCRISY ON GUN CONTROL

"Hypocritical nonsense," is the way Connecticut investigative writer Henry Berry describes Governor Dannel Malloy's statements and posturing following the deadly elementary school shootings in Newtown.

Berry points to Malloy's longstanding knowledge of extensive, systematic, persistence crime and corruption throughout the criminal and civil sectors of the state legal system. Berry can verify this because some time ago he sent an email on this to Malloy when Malloy was under criminal investigation when Richard Blumenthal was state attorney general.

Berry's email related determined, systematic, coordinated, vicious targeting of him by state's attorneys and investigators and by members of the Pullman and Comley law firm after Berry filed a criminal complaint against Pullman and Comley lawyers James T. Shearin and Timothy A. Bishop (no longer with the firm) for theft of close to \$6,000.00 of medical films meant for an operation on his neck he left with them at their request.

Until Berry was able to prove otherwise upon discovering incriminating documents in the course of a civil case, the lawyers Shearin and Bishop lied that he had ever dropped off the films, implying Berry was engaging in extortion.

Following the complaint, Berry was targeted for an illegal wiretap based on false statements by an underworld resource, entrapment schemes for drug and/or sex crimes, defamation, and witness intimidation including stalking, menacing, and threats of violence and injury. As Berry describes, "The state's attorneys were acting as a protection racket for criminal corporate lawyers."

Berry also encountered collusion of judges William Rush and Thomas Nadeau, bribery of the judge L. Scott Melville, tampering with evidence, witness tampering, perjury, and subornation of perjury.

Besides Malloy's certain knowledge of the crime and corruption, Berry also points to Malloy's long close association with Andrew McDonald, a one-time partner at the Pullman and Comley law firm. McDonald was selected as his legal counsel when Malloy was elected governor; and with known criminal associations is now a member of the Connecticut Supreme Court after being nominated by Malloy. Furthermore, the Pullman and Comley law firm has close ties with the Malloy administration despite Malloy's knowledge of its extensive criminal activity and corruption subversive of the state legal system.

Berry remarks, "It's implicit when someone like Malloy argues that individuals should reduce or give up means for protecting themselves that the government will do this. It's clear though that Malloy does not subscribe to this. When you realize that Malloy is a former prosecutor, his

practices and self-serving aims about gun control trying to capitalize on the horrific Newtown incident are not only hypocritical – they're alarming."
