



**AFFIDAVIT OF SENATOR LOUIS C. DELUCA
OCTOBER 15, 2007**


I, Louis C. DeLuca, hereby depose and say:

1. I am over eighteen years of age and I understand the obligations of an oath.
2. In the early spring of 2005, I contacted Waterbury Police Chief Neil O'Leary and I told him that my granddaughter was being physically abused in a domestic relationship.
3. I told Chief O'Leary that my granddaughter did not want the police involved, but that my family and I were very concerned for her physical safety and we wanted him to intervene.
4. Chief O'Leary told me that he could not help without cooperation from my granddaughter.
5. Later in the spring of 2005, after not having success with Chief O'Leary and desperate to help my granddaughter, I approached James Galante and asked him for assistance in stopping the physical, domestic abuse of my granddaughter.
6. I had met Mr. Galante approximately ten years earlier through politics.
7. As a result of my request, Mr. Galante agreed to have someone pay a "visit" to the person abusing my granddaughter.
8. It is my understanding that the "visit" never occurred.
9. I did not and do not have a corrupt relationship with Mr. Galante or anybody else.
10. I have not introduced, opposed or impacted any legislation for the benefit of Mr. Galante or his business.

11. I have not made any legislative appointments for the benefit of Mr. Galante or his business.
12. On September 5, 2006, I was approached by an undercover law enforcement agent who advised me that agents from the Federal Bureau of Investigation would likely want to interview me about why I had met with Mr. Galante.
13. On September 7, 2006, FBI agents did interview me and, as a result of my conversation with the undercover agent, I provided the FBI agents with a false story as to why I had met with Mr. Galante.
14. On September 21, 2006, the FBI interviewed me again and I corrected the false story from the earlier interview and I advised the FBI of the real reason that I had met with Mr. Galante.
15. I deeply regret the decisions that I made in this matter and I accepted responsibility for my conduct by willfully and voluntarily pleading guilty to the misdemeanor charge of conspiracy to threaten.
