It is also my present intention, per the Committee's request, to respond under oath to the statement read into the record by Senator DeLuca during the October 15, 2007 hearing.



Senator DeLuca has continued to malign both this Department and me personally. As you can imagine, it is very frustrating to listen to the Senator's comments with the only recourse being submission of written responses to the Committee.

To Protect and To Serve

It is with this in mind that I respectfully request that I be invited to the November 1, 2007 meeting of the Committee so that I may be sworn in and read my response into the record under oath. Since Senator DeLuca has already had this opportunity, I believe that in the interest of fairness and equity that I should be afforded that same opportunity.

Since my appearance before the Review Committee would not be testimony per se because it will not involve questioning by the Review Committee, I believe that this limited appearance would conform to the spirit of the resolution that created the Review Committee.
