ANDREW BURR (1696-1763) of Fairfield, Connecticut; Lieutenant of Second Company of Fairfield (Train Band) 1731; Captain, 1733; Major in Fourth Connecticut Regiment, 1739; Colonel in the Connecticut Forces at the Siege of Louisburg, 1745; Speaker of the Assembly of Connecticut, 1745; Member of the War Committee for New Haven, 1746; Colonel of Fourth Regiment of Fairfield, 1750; Deputy for Fairfield, 1727-'47; Justice of the Peace, 1727-'45; Judge of County, 1745-'63; Speaker, 1741 *et seq.*; appointed to receive arms and accoutrements belonging to the King, used by soldiers in the Campaign against Crown Point, 1757.
