JAMES TYLER PATTERSON, JR., Republican, born in Milford, Connecticut, April 28, 1908; educated at Yale College, B.A. 1930; Yale Law School, LL.B. 1933; member of the Connecticut Bar; Deputy Judge, Town Court of Milford, 1938-1942; member and chairman, Old Lyme Board of Education, 1947-1953; elected to House of Representatives from Old Lyme in 1951 and subsequent sessions; member at various times, Committees on Appropriations, Education, Labor, Elections and Rules; member, Connecticut Commission on Intergovernmental Cooperation, 1955-1959; member, Legislative Council, 1959 to date; Majority Leader of the House of Representatives, 1961 session; elected Speaker of the House, January, 1963.
