

MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday September 24, 2013

1:00 PM

Room 1B - Legislative Office Building

I. The meeting was called to order at 1:15 p.m. by the Chairman of the Law Revision Commission, Rep. Arthur J. O'Neill, 69th District. Members present were: Rep. Arthur J. O'Neill, Attorney William R. Breetz, Sen. Eric D. Coleman, 2nd District, Rep. Daniel J. Fox, 148th District, Attorney Benjamin Gettinger, Attorney Eleanor Michael, and Attorney Neal Ossen.

II. Commission members introduced themselves and welcomed Attorney Benjamin Gettinger as a new member of the commission.

III. Chairman O'Neill provided a brief history of the Law Revision Commission. Chairman O'Neill then discussed the commission's duty to conduct a study pursuant to Section 5 of Public Act 13-213 regarding the fairness and adequacy of state statutes relating to the award of alimony in actions for dissolution of marriage, legal separation or annulment. Chairman O'Neill indicated that he is working on a list of members for the study committee.

IV. A motion was made by Attorney Breetz to authorize Chairman O'Neill to (1) establish and appoint members to a study committee to undertake the study required by Section 5 of Public Act 13-213, and (2) seek assistance from staff as needed to complete the study. The motion was duly seconded and passed unanimously on a voice vote.

V. Chairman O'Neill discussed the possibility of an additional study concerning the Uniform Arbitration Act and suggested that the commission may meet again to authorize such a study.

VI. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
