

**OFA FACT SHEET: HIGHER EDUCATION
CONNECTICUT STATE UNIVERSITY SUMMARY**

The Connecticut State University System is part of the newly established Board of Regents for Higher Education. The state universities offer baccalaureate, graduate, and professional degrees in over one hundred and sixty subject areas. There are four colleges serving students across the state. The General Fund budgeted appropriation for the Connecticut State University System within the Board of Regents for Higher Education in FY 14 is \$148.6 million and the Operating Fund budget is \$417.9 million.

The table below provides a summary for each state university, including: enrollment, full time faculty, part time faculty, and the top five completions for each institution.
