

OFA BILL ANALYSIS

SSB 35

AN ACT CONCERNING THE AUTHORIZATION OF BONDS OF THE STATE FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND OTHER PURPOSES

SUMMARY: This bill authorizes the issuance of \$483,525,000 in General Obligation bonds of which \$42,405,000 are self-liquidating. It also reduces prior authorizations by a total of \$101,417,617 and makes various language changes.

EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 1992
