EXPLANATION OF ESTIMATES:

STATE AND MUNICIPAL IMPACT: Passage of this bill as amended requires the Office of Policy and Management (OPM), with the Department of Public Works (DPW) to connect all state-owned buildings to district heating and cooling systems where such systems exist or are planned, as soon as practicable and where cost-effective. OPM and DPW are anticipated to handle this responsibility within their normal budgetary resources.

The bill as amended eliminates annual reporting requirements for OPM and instead requires OPM to submit a comprehensive energy plan by 1/1/94 and every four years thereafter.

Senate "B" makes a technical change and has no fiscal impact.

House "A" gives additional responsibilities to the Secretary of OPM. It is anticipated that the cost to undertake them will be minimal.
