EXPLANATION OF ESTIMATES:

It is anticipated that there will be additional responsibility for the Department of Liquor Control associated with the department approving an alphabetic identification system. It is anticipated that this responsibility can be handled within normal budgetary resources.

Senate "A" establishes that no manufacturer may sell beer in a keg in this State unless such manufacturer places on the keg, a three letter alphabetic identification system. It has a minimal cost impact.
