

House of Representatives, April 9, 1998. The Committee on Appropriations reported through REP. DYSON, 94th DIST., Chairman of the Committee on the part of the House, that the substitute bill ought to pass.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE YOUTH SERVICE BUREAU GRANT PROGRAM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 10-190  
2 of the general statutes is repealed and the  
3 following is substituted in lieu thereof:

4 (a) The Commissioner of Education shall  
5 establish a program to provide grants to youth  
6 service bureaus in accordance with this section.  
7 Only youth service bureaus which were eligible to  
8 receive grants pursuant to this section for the  
9 fiscal year ending June 30, [1996] 1998, or which  
10 applied for a grant by May 15, [1996] 1998, with  
11 prior approval of the town's contribution pursuant  
12 to subsection (b) of this section, shall be  
13 eligible for a grant pursuant to this section for  
14 any fiscal year commencing on or after July 1,  
15 [1996] 1998. Each such youth service bureau shall  
16 receive a grant of twelve thousand dollars. The  
17 Department of Education may expend an amount not  
18 to exceed two per cent of the amount appropriated  
19 for purposes of this section for administrative  
20 expenses. If there are any remaining funds, each  
21 such youth service bureau that was awarded a grant  
22 in excess of fifteen thousand dollars in the

23 fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, shall receive a  
24 percentage of such funds. The percentage shall be  
25 determined as follows: For each such grant in  
26 excess of fifteen thousand dollars, the difference  
27 between the amount of the grant awarded to the  
28 youth service bureau for the fiscal year ending  
29 June 30, 1995, and fifteen thousand dollars shall  
30 be divided by the difference between the total  
31 amount of the grants awarded to all youth service  
32 bureaus that were awarded grants in excess of  
33 fifteen thousand dollars for said fiscal year and  
34 the product of fifteen thousand dollars and the  
35 number of such grants for said fiscal year.

36 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect July 1,

STATE AND MUNICIPAL IMPACT: This bill results in a potential cost to the state and thus a potential revenue gain to municipalities. Based on known applications \$15,000 has been provided in the budget as passed by the Appropriations Committee for this purpose.

**AN ACT CONCERNING THE YOUTH SERVICE BUREAU GRANT PROGRAM**

**SUMMARY:** This bill expands the youth service bureaus that are eligible for grants from the State Department of Education starting in FY 1998-99 to include those that either (1) are eligible for such grants in the current fiscal year (FY 1997-98) or (2) applied for a grant by May 15, 1998 after receiving approval of the town's matching contribution. Currently, only bureaus that were eligible for grants in FY 1994-95 and applied

by May 15, 1996 are eligible.

Youth service bureau grants are for \$12,000, with any excess funds distributed among bureaus that received grants of more than \$15,000 in FY 1994-95.
